St Nicholas Roman Catholic Church

Over the last year under the direction of our new Priest in Charge Father Joby Lukose the Catholic community of St Nicholas Winchcombe has grown and developed in many different ways.

Mass is celebrated each <u>Sunday morning at 11am</u> and again on Thursday mornings <u>at 10am</u>. Mass is also said on Holy days of Obligation and various other feast days, these are notified on our notice board outside St Nicholas and on our website <u>www.threesaintsgloucs.org</u>, a combined website for the three parishes Fr Joby serves.

We also look after St James's Chapel Postlip, which is a 12th Century Grade 1 listed chapel that is one of the oldest Catholic chapels in use today and part of our parish. Masses are held monthly between May and October and on St James's Feast Day. We are currently fundraising to support the maintenance and restoration of the Chapel as it's so important not to allow this historic church to fall into disrepair.

- Held two coffee morning's in the Guide Hall before Easter and Christmas, again enjoyed by the whole community especially the craft session for children.
- Been a venue for the music and arts festival last September
- Had a stall at the Winchcombe Country Show with face painting, children's games as well as other items on the stall.
- Participated at the Winchcombe Christmas Festival running a tombola stall and mulled wine, as tradition on Feast of St Nicholas we gave out sweets to all



Supporting communities overseas:

The Ukrainian flag flies with the Papal flag showing our solidarity, a family of four lives with one of our parishioners. Through the family we have sent supplies back to Ukraine.

We have supported the parish of St Peter Claver in Bo Sierra Leone helping them build their church. We now move on to support a parish in Soweto the diocese of Dodoma in Tanzania to build a church, currently the walls of their church are made with mud and when the rains come each year they are washed away.
